What does it mean to establish a tandem?

You are free to organize your activities as it fits best for your interests and demands. But there are some core aspects to consider:

- 1) Tandems should be **active for at least 6 months**, means we need a concrete starting point and a certain point after 6 months when you are able to turn in a **short report** on your joint activities.
- 2) To identify a potential tandem partner you should be able to express clearly **what is your expertise** and what do you want to get from this partnership.
- 3) When you found your tandem partner you should together **define a couple of core questions** you want to exchange on, and brainstorm what could be the **benefits** for both tandem partners. Keep a written record of these questions.
- 4) Set up a couple of informal (online) **meetings**, e.g. once a months, with dedicated topics,

An example below - please remember your are free to define the exact topics!

- Meeting 1 Get to know your tandem partner (e.g. personal background, CV, career steps, position, personal motivation to apply for the tandem activities)
- Meeting 2 Get to know the partner university better, including their institutional environment, regional integration (always from the perspective of your respective position in the organization).
- Meeting 3 Discuss your job profiles, day-to-day responsibilities, and structures and services of your units/institutions identifying best practices.
- Meeting 4 Discuss how your involvement in FIT FORTHEM / FORTHEM or in general in international environment may influence your personal and professional development
- Meeting 5 Identify possible future joint activities for you as tandem partners, but also for your institutional units in the framework of FORTHEM and FIT FORTHEM. What could be the concrete benefits for your working units?
- Meeting 6 Prepare a short report on your activities of max. 3 pages along the core questions you identified and turn this in at fitforthem@uni-mainz.de
- 5) Check if an **ERASMUS + Staff Training mobility action (SST)** could be integrated in your planned activities and apply for addition ERASMUS+ funding to visit your partner. Meating in person at least once e.g. to intensify the exchange on your core questions helps to get a better idea of the working conditions of your tandem partner.
- 6) Check if you can **find a model** also to socially interact with your partners despite possibly **only meeting virtually**.
- 7) Check if you can integrate **aspects** of **multiculturalism** and **multilingualism**, for example try to present your organization in the language of your partner or include a session on the cultural and regional background of your tandem partners organization.
